

HOME COMMUNITY BASED CARE HARD AT WORK

Since April 2016 Home Community Based Care services have changed towards focus areas as indicated below:

- 1) Health Screenings of clients during home visit;
- 2) As a result of Screenings it is expected that **MORE PRIMARY HEALTH CARE REFERRALS** to the clinics will be generated;
- 3) HCBC to thus **SUPPORT THE CLINICS** in service delivery and with referrals to primary health care;
- 4) Health Promotion, Prevention and Adherence are **SERVICE DELIVERY OBJECTIVES**;
- 5) Basic Care focus only **10%** of service delivery

With objectives regarding Health Promotion, -Prevention and -Adherence in mind the Community Health Workers were challenged to host certain Health Calendar events in the areas where they work. Planning and implementing of these events were left entirely up to them. They were minimally assisted by the Coordinators and they came up with very innovative ideas.

Some of the Community Health Workers thought of the following:

- Knitting bed socks and scarfs; then selling it to collect funds to use for events.
- Getting donations (rolls and Vienna's) to give to clients when they participate in the events.
- Having lucky draws with small prizes for the clients while attending the event.
- Handing out of second hand clothing and bags of porridge at the events.

All these ideas are wonderful initiatives to attract more people to the events and at the same time they can educate, screen and assist the community members. Some events were also done in co-operation with partners like Department of Health and the George Municipality.
